**Report under the Environment (Wales) Act 2016**

Llangammarch Community Council (LCC) is responsible for the management of the Tan y Deri Playground area and the Riverside Gardens in Llangammarch.	
<b>Action Carried Out</b>	<b>Monitored by:</b>
Any planting to be as diverse as possible and where possible including native, wild species. This is to support a diverse insect population and in turn, the birds and mammals that feed on them.	Councillor responsible for planting in the Riverside Gardens
The large ecosystems within LCC area are not managed by LCC – namely the River Irfon (NRW) and parts of the Crychan Forest (NRW). LCC has made its position on the use of glyphosate known to both NRW and to Powys CC, both of whom use this chemical routinely. LCC prefers a less toxic alternative to be investigated.	N/A
Limited mowing of the grass in the Riverside allows to natural habitats to be maintained and especially the diversity of wild flowers on the riverside. Rainwater is saved from the public toilet roof in the Riverside Gardens to be used wherever possible for watering plants. Weeding in and around the playground to be done by hand and prevention using organic methods.	Councillor responsible for planting in the Riverside Gardens
Workshops are put on annually to encourage enhancement of diversity (e.g. build a bug hotel) and talk given to encourage residents to do what they can. Interpretation boards will be provided for the riverside areas	The whole council
Filling of personal water-bottles – setting up a refill station at the toilet block to encourage cyclists to use refillable containers.	The Clerk and Councillor responsible for the toilet block
